

Phonological Awareness Parent Screener

Phonological Awareness is a broad range of skills that progressively get harder. Because students develop PA skills at different rates, approximate timelines of when neurotypical students master each skill are listed.

- 1. Concept of Spoken Word (preschool/kindergarten): The ability to identify individual words in a sentence.
 - a. How many words are in this sentence? I like apples. (3 words)
- 2. Rhyme (preschool/kindergarten): The ability to recognize, complete, and produce rhyme.
 - a. Recognition: Does pick rhyme with stick? (yes)
 - b. Completion: Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall. Humpty Dumpty had a great___. (fall)
 - c. Production: What word or pretend word rhymes with ball? (call)
- 3. Syllable (kindergarten): The ability to blend, segment, and delete syllables.
 - a. Blending: Foot and ball together say ____. (football)
 - b. Segmenting: Clap the word parts in rainbow. (2 claps)
 - c. Deletion: Say cupcake without cake. (cup)
- 4. Phonemes (sounds) (kindergarten second grade): The ability to recognize and manipulate sounds.

*When a letter is in between "//", for example, "/ t /" it means to say the letter's sound

- a. Isolation of first sound: What is the first sound in the word dot? (/d/)
- b. Isolation of final sound: what is the last sound in the word sun? (/n/)
- c. Sound blending with word families: what is this word? /t/ /op/ (top)
- d. Sound blending of all sounds: What is this word /p/ /i/ /g/? (pig)
- e. Sound segmentation: What are the individual sounds you hear in pot? (/p/ /o/ /t/)
- f. Sound deletion of first sound: Say take without the /t/. (ake)
- g. Sound deletion of final sound: Say big without the /g/. (/bĭ/)
- h. Adding sounds: Say /it/. Now add /s/ to the beginning. (sit)
- i. Sounds substitution of first sound: replace the first sound in back with /t/. (tack)
