

Best Practices for Recording and Uploading Application Video

Before You Record

Best devices for recording:

- Phone/iPad
- Movie Maker
- Photo booth
- Laptop camera

Recording Standards

Before you begin recording, make sure you have enough space on your device for a large file. **Do not record in high definition.** Change your camera settings before you begin to be sure you are not recording in high definition. See the list below which shows lowest to highest:

- Standard video recording:
 - 720p HD at 30fps: 40MB per minute
 - **1080p HD at 30fps (default resolution): 60MB per minute (Recommended)**
 - 1080p HD at 60fps (smoother video): 90MB per minute
 - 4K at 24fps: 135MB per minute
 - 4K at 30fps: 170MB per minute
 - 4K at 60fps: 400MB per minute

Compressing your video

Try to keep your video file size as low as possible for less time-consuming uploads. If you have already recorded your video and the file is still too large, try compressing and/or zipping the file to reduce the size.

Using a zip file for video compression

Use the zip folder option to compress the file for upload. This option is the simplest way to compress the folder but sometimes it's not enough to make uploading faster and easier. For multiple files, add all the file to one folder, then zip the file. See link below for instructions:

Uploading your Video

- Best apps to upload your video:
 - Google Drive
 - YouTube
 - Dropbox
- Keep in mind that uploading your video can take up to one hour or more.
- Remember to close other applications on your device and/or other devices that use the internet in your home. Other actively streaming devices may slow down your upload speed.
- Try to use the highest internet speed possible when uploading. If you know the internet speed in your home or school is not the best, try going to your local library or coffee shop.

Uploading your video to Google Drive, YouTube or Dropbox

You can upload your video directly to Google Drive, YouTube, or Dropbox from your phone or tablet. Keep in mind, you may have to download the app first.
