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



Educational Assistant Vowel Intensive Drill

Follow the directions provided for each game listed below.

Be the Vowel Game:

 Students decorate the edges of a paper plate and write their assigned vowel in the middle of the plate. When the teacher dictates a vowel sound, students who "are" that sound repeat the sound and stand up with their plate while stating the letter name and sound.

M&M's® Vowel Sort:

 Label paper cups with vowels and dictate sounds while students put M&M's® in the appropriate cup.

Vowel Bean Bag Toss:

 The teacher dictates a sound and tosses a beanbag to a student. After catching the beanbag, the student repeats the sound. The student then holds up the correct vowel tent while verbalizing the letter name and sound.





Educational Assistant Word Dictation

Follow the directions provided for the activity listed below.

Sound Hopping:

Materials Needed: Hula-Hoops™, sidewalk chalk

 Directions: Select words from the dictation list. Call out the words to your students. For each word, students repeat the word, then hop into a new hoop each time they say a sound in the word. Then, give the students chalk and let them spell the word on the pavement or blacktop.

Educational Assistant Red Words

Follow the directions provided for each activity listed below.

Red Word Creative Writing:

• Students choose three to four mastered Red Words and incorporate them into a creative writing activity. Provide a sentence starter if they need one.

Red Word Matching:

Write mastered Red Words on index cards or paper. (Duplicate each word so that there are two
cards with the same word.) Place the cards face down. Students will turn over two cards at a time,
trying to find a match. When a match is found, students will say the word and armtap the spelling.

Third Time's a Charm!:

• Students spell the Red Word three times in three different silly voices.

Explosion (Volcano):

• Students start spelling the Red Word at a whisper, get louder with each letter, and explode when they say the word at the end.

Stomping:

• Students stomp out each letter in the Red Word with their foot while spelling the word aloud.
